First clean the inside of the cup and dish, and then the outside also will be clean."

The simplicity of Christianity is: We sinned. Christ died. God forgave.

I don't want a **Killjoy God**, I want a **Life-Joy God**. I look forward to sharing with you on Sunday the life-giving joy that Jesus can give.
