In my devotional reading for this morning, ([Mark 11:12-14](#)) Jesus is hungry and he sees a fig tree and even though it is not the season for figs to be on the tree, Jesus is disappointed and he curses the tree.

I've always felt that this was a warning to all his followers that we are to bear fruit even when it may not seem that the season is right. There are always opportunities to share the Good News. Just because we are confined to our homes during this particular season, we can still bear fruit.

Another reason this scripture touches me is that it reminds us that Jesus was human. This takes place just after Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. It is a very emotional time for Jesus and I think we see more of his humanity than at any other time.

During this week between Palm Sunday and Easter, he is angry, hungry, disappointed, discouraged, grateful and resigned. These are very human feelings and emotions.

This week we will experience all of these emotions with him as we journey through Holy Thursday, Good Friday and finally to Easter Sunday and the resurrection where we will see not just his humanity but also his divinity.
